How do I sign up?

If you're interested in watching the show free of commercials (we recommend it), there's a \$2.50 charge. If not, don't worry about it.

1. Click on this site http://virtualarts.tv/wiredartsfest/online-tickets/

2. Choose the program you're interested in; Saturday (March, Program C-TITS & Words of Choice: Roe at 40) (8pm)


3. Go through the online and billing process as directed.

Note: Definitely pay and get all set up ahead of time. You will have to set up a PayPal. It takes about 15 minutes to go through the process and you want to make sure you're all squared away before your party.

What's the Twitter deal?

As a viewer, you'll watch the performance on a screen like this. This will allow you to connect your social media platforms and share your opinions and stories. Make sure to sign for Ustream social chat ahead of time. You will receive an email confirmation and will be able to chat either on the social stream through Facebook or Twitter OR through the social stream, disconnected from your social media platforms. Using the hashtags #wiredartstv, #woclive and #Screenforchoice you can share your stories, react to individual pieces, and tweet questions for the post show discussion.



What about the app?

WiredArtsFestTV developed an app for the event, which will allow you to set an online appointment to remind you about upcoming shows and take and share photos of your viewing party instantly. You can also connect to your Facebook and Twitter, so that you can tweet directly from the app and see what other viewers are saying as you watch the performance!

How can I get postcards?

Drop us an email – info@abortionrights.ie, and we'll send you 5 postcards and an information sheet. We'll have a downloadable version up here soon that you can print off and stick in an envelope either.

How many can I get?

How many people can *you* get to send them? We'll send you 5 postcards for each. Just let us know in your email.

Who are my TDs?

Check out this fabulous website – www.whoismytd.com – where you can simply type in your address and it will give you contacts for all of your representatives in the Dáil.

I'm part of a group who supports this campaign, how can we help?

Have a table / stall at an event: do you have a public event between now and summer? The Abortion Rights Campaign can give you a box of postcards and explanatory flyers and you can have a 'postcards' table at your event. All members need to do is sign their name and home address on 5 postcards and we can take care of the rest. If you need people to run these stalls, the Abortion Rights Campaign will be happy to help. Please drop an email to info@abortionrights.ie to let us know about your event. We will happily publicise it to our members too.

Notify your members of the campaign so they can request postcards themselves: Let your members / supporters know that this campaign is happening, and they can email info@ abortionrights.ie to request postcards that we can send out.

Send postcards to your members: the Abortion Rights Campaign can give you a box of postcards and explanatory flyers and you can send 5 postcards and a flyer to each of your members. Your members can find their representatives by entering their home address in www.whoismytd.com. We appreciate there is a cost incurred for organisations here but appreciate any financial support available. Get active!

a.k.a. What else can I do now?

1. CONNECT - Abortion Rights Campaign with regional groups represented by delegates around Ireland. To connect to a group in your locality, contact info@ abortionrights.ie or go to http://www.abortionrightscampaign.ie/get-involved/

2. DROP INTO your local councillors and let them know that their constituents represent the pro-choice majority.

3. GET INFORMED - Visit an IFPA or local clinic. Speak with the volunteer coordinator to find out more about what they do. Research organizations in your community. What is their perspective on pregnancy, contraception and abortion? Contact people in your constituency. Where do they stand on the issues you care about and what action have they taken? Inform others about what you have learned.

4. SUPPORT an abortion fund that helps low-income women who travel from the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland to Britain for abortion services. The Abortion Support Network (http://www.abortionsupport.org.uk/) Host a screening of Words of Choice as a fundraiser for your local abortion fund.

5. SURVEY the availability of emergency contraception in local hospitals and pharmacies. Emergency contraception is supposed to be available for sale without a doctor's prescription at pharmacies in the Ireland for women age 17 and over. Ask your local pharmacies if or another brand of emergency contraception is immediately available for purchase and what it costs. Know your rights; read the advice of the IFPA http://www.ifpa.ie/Hot-Topics/Emergency-Contraception/ Emergency-Contraception-Explained 6. USE YOUR CREATIVITY! Words of Choice developed out of Cindy Cooper's background as a playwright and journalist. How can you combine your creative side (art, music, writing or anything that helps you express yourself) with your interest in protecting and supporting reproductive freedom? If you'd like to work in a supportive group, why not get in touch with the Creative and Direct Actions Working Group, one of the five pillars of the national campaign.
